Bonnie Hambrick, City Secretary, read the captions of the Ordinances aloud.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Clay, seconded by Councilmember McCain to approve the Consent Agenda. The motion carried unanimously.

UPDATE ON CODE ENFORCEMENT AND DISCUSS EXCESSIVE LITTER WITHIN THE CITY OF ATHENS

Audrey Sloan, Director of Development Services, presented a chart of code enforcement cases generated from October 2018 to present. Ms. Sloan explained that tall grass and rubbish and debris violations are the top two (2) violations. She stated the department has identified problem areas, with goals being created to ensure the department operates in an efficient manner.

Ms. Sloan explained the department goals as follows:

- Proactive Code Enforcement
- Reorganization of Department
- Focus on key areas/issues
- Improve record keeping & reporting

Mayor Montgomery stated Ms. Sloan has addressed every issue he had. He explained that he received complaints regarding Highway 31. Mayor Montgomery stated he spoke with Ms. Morton and the Keep Athens Beautiful clean-up is scheduled for April. He stated there was discussion regarding having a weekend clean-up prior to the April clean-up date.

Ms. Borstad stated in the future there may be a possibility to have a small on-call contract to pick up trash within the problem areas. She stated she will research this possibility.

After discussions, it was the consensus to have a "call for" a Saturday clean-up day prior to the KAB April clean up and invite sponsors to provide lunch.

Councilmember Smith stated it is everyone's responsibility to keep Athens clean.

DISCUSS FIRST READING OF AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TOTAL APPROPRIATIONS BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2019 FOR ALLOCATION OF GENERAL FUND \$38,322.00, EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT FUND \$62,645.00, HOTEL OCCUPANCY TAX FUND \$18,596.76, AND UTILITY FUND \$56,817.53

Mandie Quigg, Finance Director, explained the item is the first reading of an Ordinance amending the total appropriations budget for Fiscal Year ending September 30, 2019. She stated there were outstanding projects for which the City had committed to procuring and the budgeted appropriations for those approved projects were not incurred as anticipated in Fiscal Year 2018. Ms. Quigg further explained the purchase commitments must be re-encumbered to the FY 2019 year, reallocating the Fund Balance for the expenditures.

Ms. Quigg reviewed the following purchase order commitments from Fiscal Year 2018:

General Fund:

Peach Park Improvements Athens, TX 75751 \$38,322.00

Hotel Occupancy Tax Fund:

Downtown Façade Improvements \$18,596.76

Utility Fund: \$56,817.53

Ms. Quigg explained the supplemental appropriation is for equipment to be used in the Fire Department. She stated staff has recommended the use of the Equipment Replacement Fund to fund the request to purchase eight (8) MSA Air Packs and 19 Face Masks at a cost of \$62,645.00.

Ms. Hambrick read the caption of the Ordinance aloud.

DISCUSS, CONSIDER AND TAKE ACTION, AS NECESSARY, CONCERNING THE APPROVAL OF A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO INCLUDE THE PLACEMENT OF THE ATHENS INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT "HORNET" LOGO ONTO THE LOOP 7 WATER TOWER AS PART OF THE WATER TOWER REHABILITATION PROJECT

Randy Williams, Utilities Director, explained staff is requesting Council's direction for the appearance of logos on the Loop 7 Water Tower. He stated the project includes specifications for two (2) logos 10 feet in size and up to five (5) colors. He stated the contractor's cost is \$5,000 for each unit.

Mayor Montgomery asked if the school had requested to place the hornet logo onto the Loop 7 tower, with Mr. Williams stating yes.

There was discussion regarding the placement of the logo.

Councilmember McCain asked if Trinity Valley Community College had contacted the City about placing the cardinal logo on the tower, with Mr. Williams stating no.

After discussion, Councilmember McCain asked that staff contact Trinity Valley Community College (TVCC) to find out if they are interested in the placement of the "Cardinal" logo on the tower

After a brief discussion Mayor Montgomery entertained a motion to approve a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to include the placement of the Athens Independent School District "Hornet" logo onto the Loop 7 Water Tower as part of the Water Tower Rehabilitation Project.

The item died due to the lack of a motion.
