ORDINANCE NO. 2021-O-152

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ATHENS, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-4 OF THE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES REGARDING THE DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS, PROVIDING A REPEALER CLAUSE, A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on the 11th day of October 2021, the City Council of the City of Athens, Texas after due notice as required by law, held the first reading of the ordinance as required by Article III, Section 3.11 of the City of Athens Charter.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATHENS, TEXAS

Section 1. The City Council hereby authorizes the amendment of Chapter 14, Sections 14-4(b) & 14-4(c)(4) as shown below. For clarity, the text to be amended within the ordinance is shown in highlights.

CHAPTER 14, SECTION 14-4 – DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS AND OTHER GUNS WITHIN CITY LIMITS

- a) It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge any gun, pistol or firearm of any kind, including air rifles or pistols, or compressed air or gas operated pellet or dart guns or pistols, in, on, along or across any public street, alley, park, schoolground or any public lands within the city.
- b) It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge any gun, pistol or firearm of any kind, including air rifles or pistols, or compressed air or gas operated pellet or dart guns or pistols for the purposes of testing, training, sport shooting, target shooting, and/or repetitive recreational shooting on any private property or any public lands within the city.
- c) Exceptions.
 - 1) The discharge of a firearm by a licensed peace officer in the course and scope of his/her official duties;
 - 2) The discharge of a firearm by a person exercising any right expressly or impliedly granted by the laws of this state or the laws of the United States, the exercise of which expressly or impliedly includes the discharging of firearms; or
 - 3) The discharge of a firearm within an approved shooting range, so long as no projectile from firearm crosses onto another property when discharged.
 - 4) The discharge of a firearm for the purpose of hunting and sighting on a contiguous tract of private property larger than 20 acres, so long as no projectile from the firearm crosses onto another property when discharged.
- d) Penalty. This section is hereby declared to be a health and safety ordinance for the safety of the inhabitants of the City and any person violating this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not less than five dollars (\$5.00) and not more than

two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00); and each violation hereof shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 2. Should any clause, phrase, sentence section of this Ordinance be deemed invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, said finding shall not affect the remaining clauses, phrases, sentences or sections of this Ordinance.

Section 3. Any ordinance, resolution or order previously passed and/or adopted by the City Council, or any part thereof, if found to be in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be resolved in favor of the terms and conditions of this Ordinance, and any prior conflicting ordinance, resolution or order or any part thereof, is hereby repealed to the extent of said conflict.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be and become effective from and after its adoption and publication in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of Athens, Texas.
