Rejoice! Again I Say, REJOICE!

Easter falls on April Fools Day this year. I think this is very appropriate. For many, those of us who do believe are considered fools. Well, if that is what I am, I will be a fool for Christ. I can understand their skepticism. Who on earth rises from the dead?

In the New Testament, it is reported that Jesus raised several people from the dead—Lazarus was raised by Jesus in John 11:44, and Jairus's daughter in Mark 5:41. Then you have the son of the widow at Nain (Luke 7:11-14), Tabitha in Acts 9:40, and Eutychus in Acts 20:9-10.

But what is amazing to me is that the resurrection of Jesus had such an affect on the world. Because of the witness of his disciples, it literally changed the course of our history from pagan to Christianity. This is the most radical change in all of world history!

And yet that is changing rapidly. The United States, whose coinage declares "In God We Trust," is quickly becoming more and more God-less. We live in a mission field where the norm is no longer Christianity but the "nones"—those who believe in nothing at all.

Either we wake up and change our ways to reach the changing world or our salvation story becomes lost. Jesus Christ died for our sins. Shouldn't we at least share the story—before the world dies from their sins and we along with them for not continuing to tell the story?

This Easter, bring your family for that life-saving story we all need to hear. No fooling—it is that important.

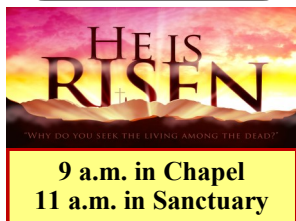

Summer Mission Project

One of FUMC-Orange's VCI prescriptions calls for us to reach out to the community in a meaningful way—offering help without cost to them.



Years ago, FUMC started The Last Blast, which over time morphed into Back-to-School Orange. FUMC is now WITHOUT a mission emphasis of our own.

Council has approved a "meals on wheels" program for students at North Orange Early Learning Center. Our VCI community surveys said to reach out to children in the summer. Most children at this school are on school food plans during the school year and have nothing during the summer.

1. Julie Allensworth, a FUMC member and a school counselor at North Orange, will choose 30-40 students who have a need. (One church with a similar program initially invited 40 children and fed 30 children. In time, it grew to 50-60 and included recreation at the church.) We need to build a relationship of trust first to grow the program.
2. Volunteer church members and mission groups staying in the Malloy will make sandwiches daily.
3. Meals would be delivered Monday-Thursday. Most mission groups leave Friday morning and many retired folks take care of grandchildren or travel in weekends.
4. The service project will last 35 days—June-August 2 or July 31.
5. While FUMC has mission funds—"Change the World" and maybe some other mission earmarked funds—Pastor John is also applying for a grant.
6. One FUMC adult will go out with the mission team adults and youth to deliver using mission team vans when possible. If it is our youth, two adults will deliver with them. Sandwiches can be made "conveyer style"—all mission teams do that for themselves daily.

Pastor John has spoken with a congregation similar in size with mainly retired members, and this program has grown their church—so much so that they have four other church groups that help serve! Our advantage is that our helpers will come from mission teams staying at the Malloy this summer, and we will not have to create full teams of our members. The exciting part is the possibility of growing our presence in Orange and lowering the age of our average membership!

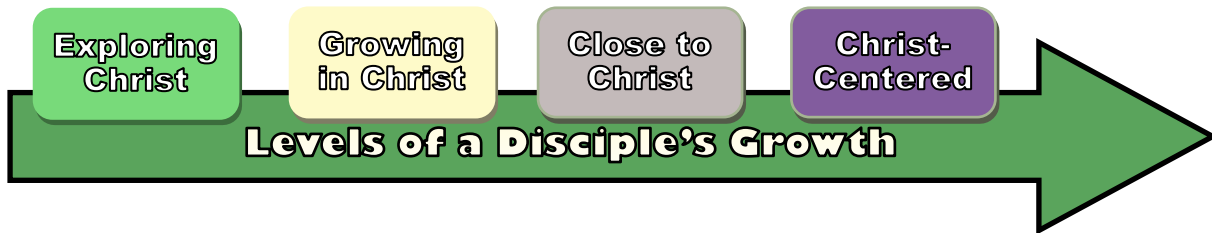

GROWING STRONGER DISCIPLES

Over the next couple of months, we will be looking at the four levels of growth into becoming a stronger Christian Disciple. We will have an overview of the levels, allowing each of us to reflect and grow in our Christian maturity.



The four growth levels are as follows:

Exploring Christ: Congregants in this segment have a basic belief in God, but they are unsure about Christ and his role in their lives. "I believe in God, but am not sure about Christ. My faith is not a significant part of my life."

Growing in Christ: Congregants in this segment have a personal relationship with Christ. They've made a commitment to trust him with their souls' salvation and for eternity, but they are just beginning to learn what that means and what it takes to develop this relationship. "I believe in Jesus and I'm working on what it means to get to know him."

Close to Christ: Congregants in this segment depend on Christ every day. They see Jesus as someone who assists them in life. On a daily basis, they turn to him for help and guidance for the issues they face. "I feel really close to Christ and depend on him daily for guidance."

Christ-Centered: Congregants in this segment identify their relationship with Christ as the most important relationship in their lives. They see their lives as fully surrendered to Jesus and his agenda, subordinating everything to his will and his desire. "My relationship with Jesus is the most important in my life. It guides everything I do."

At FUMC, we define a Christian Disciple as an ordinary person who loves Jesus and in Christ's likeness, loves and serves others, witnessing to the love of God in Christ.

Driving Directions: Claiborne West Park is located on the north side of Interstate 10, right after crossing Cow Bayou.

- ♦ From Orange, exit I-10 via Exit 869 (FM 1442) and stay on the access road through FM 1442 and continue on the access road for another half mile or so. Shortly after crossing Cow Bayou, the park entrance will appear on your right.
- ♦ From Beaumont, take Exit 864 and continue on the access road about one mile until you bear left to U-turn under the bridge at Cow Bayou. After emerging from under the bridge, the park entrance is very near on your right.

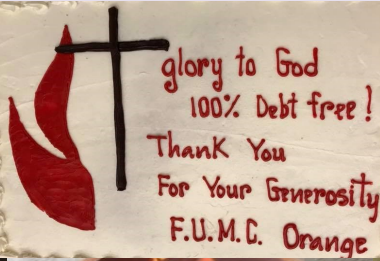
