

#### **OBITUARY**

#### Funeral Services to be Held for Jesus of Nazareth

Jesus, son of Mary and Joseph, was born in Bethlehem of Judea. At the age of two he moved with his family to Egypt. At the age of four, his family moved to the town of Nazareth in Galilee, where his father was a carpenter. Thus, he was known the rest of his life as a Nazarene. He grew in wisdom and stature and in favor with God and men. His young adult years were spent applying himself in the carpenter's trade following in the footsteps of Joseph.

At age thirty, he was baptized in the River Jordan by John the Baptist. He then began his public ministry after a short forty day leave of absence. His ministry spread from Galilee into all of Judea. His ministry attracted large crowds who came to hear him preach and to be healed. The people who gathered were witnesses to many miracles. After three years, his ministry came to an abrupt end as he was accused of crimes against the state, claiming to be something others said he was not. Jesus loved God and all sorts of people, especially those who were deemed undesirable. On Friday afternoon he humbled himself and became obedient, even to death, death upon a cross. He had attained the age of 33 years.

Jesus was survived by his mother Mary and stepfather Joseph, brothers James, Joseph, Simon, and Judas; a number of sisters; and numerous friends and close associates including Mary and Martha and their brother Lazarus.

Funeral services will be held at 6 p.m. on Friday, April 19, 2019, at the First United Methodist Church Slade Chapel, 502 N. 6<sup>th</sup> Street in Orange, Texas. In lieu of flowers, donations may be made in his memory to First United Methodist Church. In Jesus' time, the Dogwood tree had grown to a great size, like that of an Oak tree! They used it to build the cross that Jesus was hung on. This made the Dogwood tree sad.

Jesus, sensing this sadness, promised the Dogwood tree that it would never again grow large enough to build a cross. Its branches would be narrow and crooked—not good for building at all.



And now the Dogwood tree has many traits to remember this promise:

- 1) The Dogwood flower has four petals, shaped like a cross
- 2) The middle of the Dogwood flower, a crown of thorns
- 3) At the edge of each petal, a nail dent
- 4) The nail dents are stained with the color of Jesus' blood

#### **Growing Stronger Disciples**

Article from The Four Stages of a Disciple's Journey, Natalie Lavalley

#### STAGE 3: COME AND BE WITH ME (FUMC's Close to Christ)

The third invitation appears in Mark 3:14: "He appointed twelve that they might be with him"

How is this stage different from the previous? Of course we still follow Jesus, as in Stage 2. But this stage focuses on "being" more than "doing." Jesus did not call His disciples merely to carry out His instructions; He called them to share meals with Him, sit with Him, talk with Him, and simply be with Him. Ultimately He calls them His friends. "I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you" (John 15:15).

In the third stage, our relationship with God becomes less activity-focused and more intimacy-focused. We learn the value of rest and keeping the Sabbath. We may even pull back from serving in our church or ministry in order to make more space in our lives for stillness. Great things happen only when we are weak and rest in Christ, letting His strength work through us.

From the third stage, we need to grow toward complete surrender and sacrifice to God. We are enjoying intimacy with Him, but often because it makes us feel better. The focus is still on self.

However, we should not try to rush through Stage 3. The complete verse in Mark 3:14 says, "He appointed the twelve that they might be with him and that he might send them out to preach" The being with Christ comes before the sending. In Stage 3, we will naturally begin to desire growth, because as long as we remain self-centered, our intimacy with God will plateau. That is when we begin to seek an inside-out turn from self to God. Our intimacy can begin to mirror Jesus' intimacy with the Father, displayed through His prayer in Gethsemane. In this passage, we can see the intensity of Jesus' desire for us to have the intimacy with Him that He enjoys with the Father: "I pray . . . that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one—I in them and you in me—so that they may be brought to complete unity. . . . Father, I want those you have given me to be with me where I am, and to see my glory, the glory you have given me because you loved me before the creation of the world." John 17:20-24

<u>FOR CHURCH LEADERS</u> - You can help disciples in this stage move beyond focusing on themselves by teaching them to regularly practice listening to God in their times of intimacy with Him and acting on what they hear. If people are listening, God will start calling them to make sacrifices.
