Advent marks the beginning of another church year that presents the love of God revealed to the world. The Prepare the Way sermon series combines Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany together to illustrate how we are to "prepare the way of the Lord."

Week One of Advent points directly at Christ's coming—hope and encouragement. Though fear and foreboding are significant elements of this event, Jesus says, "<u>stand</u> up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near" (Lk. 21:28). Signs will be given, and God's people must be alert, constantly praying for strength, in preparation to "stand before the Son of Man" (Lk. 21:36).

Week Two begins with the question from Malachi, "who can stand when he appears?" (Mal. 3:2), which serves as **a** hinge point from the "stand" imagery of week one. Week Two's readings address issues of justice, purification, and **refining** that will accompany Jesus' coming.

Week Three of Advent is always an occasion of joy and an expectation that the people of God will "do" something to be a part of the inheritance promised to Abraham. Zephaniah instructs the people to "not let your hands grow weak" (Zep. 3:16), and John offers further teaching: "Bear fruits worthy of repentance" (Lk. 3:7-16).

The promise to Abraham is not forgotten in **Week Four**, in which Mary sings and recalls the covenant of old that shows God's mercy and justice. There are senses of preparation and nesting as both Bethlehem and Mary receive word of Jesus' coming. Both Bethlehem and Mary will be agents of <u>welcoming</u> God in flesh to earth.

Christmas Eve then becomes the point of arrival as Christ—the "Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace"—comes to the world. In the ways Jesus comes, however, it is often easy to become so overwhelmed that we cannot see the presence or work of Christ around us.

Just like Mary and Joseph, we find ourselves searching for Jesus, despite knowing all the places and ways in which Christ can be found. With enough searching, however, the promise we are given with the story of the **Epiphany**, is that all who <u>search</u> for Jesus will find him.

Jesus is coming! It is our responsibility to "prepare the way" and get ready!




