DAY 19—You Can't Bargain With God

When I was a teen, I thought I had my life all planned. I would be a commercial artist, even though God had called to ministry. I spent two and a half years in school training to that end, and then I spent another six years working in that industry.

But one Sunday morning, God called me again in church as the last hymn was being played. God said as plain as day, "How long are you going to make me wait for you?" That began my journey of negotiating with God concerning my life.



"I will train to be a youth director. God; will that satisfy you?" I found a two-year training program in Nashville to attend and registered. As the time approached, I got a call from the school letting me know that the program was ending because the school was closing. I would have to look elsewhere. A door closed. The closing of Scarett College in Nashville opened a door for me at Southwestern University in Georgetown; then on to seminary where my call to ministry was galvanized. When God closes a door, look for an open window—the window of opportunity.

"Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans." Proverbs 16:3



Disciple Fast Track Into the Word Into the World is an adaptation of the original, bestselling Disciple Bible Study Into the Word Into the World. The study is ideal for busy people who want to fit an in-depth Bible study into their schedule. The study retains the familiar Disciple format with its theme word, theme verse, statement of the human condition, daily and weekly assignments, and prayer. Into the Word helps readers deepen their understanding of Scripture and make connections between what they already know and what they are reading. Each week you will encounter three spiritual disciplines, learn what they are, and how you can engage those disciplines. The first discipline varies from week to week, then moves into Sabbath and prayer. In every session, you commit to how you will respond to Scripture in terms of ministry in the world.

Growing Stronger Disciples

STAGE 1: come and see (FUMC's Knowing Christ)

Every journey has a beginning, and our walk with Christ is no exception. Jesus' first invitation to the disciples is "Come and See." We see it most clearly in John 1:38-39, when the disciples ask, "Rabbi, where are you staying?" and Jesus replies, "Come, and you will see." Essentially, the disciples are wondering who Jesus really is. Jesus invites them to come and see what He does so they can learn for themselves that He truly is the Messiah. The "Come and See" stage applies to people who are not yet believers but who are interested in discovering what Jesus is all about.

People in this stage are often curious about Christianity, but they may also have skepticism or even hostility toward aspects of it. They commonly ask questions such as "Can I be loved?" "Is there hope?" "Do I have another chance?" To take the step into the next stage and become followers of Christ, they need an environment of authentic Christians who engage with them relationally, responding to their needs and questions.

John 1 shows that the disciples are at this stage. They meet Jesus and begin to ask Him questions. His response, "Come and see," invites them to begin a relationship with Him (John 1:39, 46). These disciples then invite others to come with them to see Jesus: "The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and tell him, 'We have found the Messiah'" and likewise "Philip found Nathanael and told him" (John 1:41-42, 45).

People in this stage need more than content and information. While responding to people's intellectual objections is important, you also need to **build relationships** with unbelievers and **show them love**. Often what holds them back from commitment to Christ is a fear or concern of the heart.

Paul writes about how he relates to people in their early stages of faith. In 1 Thessalonians 2:7, he is writing to the church that he planted in Thessalonica and reminds them that when they were infants in the faith, he was gentle "... as a nursing mother nurtures her own children." So when a seeker walks into your church, it is important to remember that this is a very tender person that God has entrusted to you. It's crucial for them to see the reality of Christ's love in a relationship.
