It's a Leap Year! That means we are blessed with one additional day this month, so February gets 29 days. We have a lot of wonderful plans packed into these 29 days. There will be several opportunities for the church to gather together for fellowship.

On the 15th, we will meet here at the church to watch the Mardi Gras Parade as it passes by on Green Avenue. After the parade, we will come back to the Family Life Center to share a meal of Gumbo and King Cake.

Then on Tuesday, Feb 25, the youth will be hosting a Mardi Gras Pancake Supper from 6-7:30 p.m. as a fundraiser for their summer camps and activities.

There is nothing like getting together as a whole church for activities. It is easy to forget that we have work to do *together* as the Body of Christ. At the beginning of January, Don and I hosted an open house at the parsonage. Several people commented how nice it was to sit and visit with folks they only see briefly at worship or in passing. We need to continue to look for opportunities to serve together and worship and fellowship together. Your church leaders have some great ideas for the coming year to do just that.

On fifth Sundays, we will all worship at one service at 10 a.m. in the Sanctuary. There will be no Sunday School, and we will have something special planned for worship each time. A time of luncheon will also be part of our special *Fabulous Fifth Sunday Fellowship*. Mark your calendars now for March, May, August, and November. We know that sometimes we haven't communicated as clearly as we could, so we are working to change that.

So with that in mind, we have already calendared other church events well in advance so you can plan ahead to partner with us in ministry and fellowship.

Ash Wednesday is in the final week of February this year. (The day after Mardi Gras "Fat Tuesday.") We will have a light supper at 5 p.m. and then join together for worship in the Slade Memorial Chapel at 6 p.m. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten Season.

Lent is a special season where we choose to grow in our faith and deepen our relationship with Jesus Christ. With that intention, this year we will be studying together a new book by Rev. Adam Hamilton called *The Walk*. I will teach the weekly lessons in a new small group class at Wednesday Night Live and can add another daytime class if there is a need. I hope that you will consider joining a small group study or reading the book along with us as we continue to grow as disciples of Jesus Christ and companions on the journey.

"This is just on my heart today. Many of us are blessed beyond measure. I know that I am certainly blessed. I have

been volunteering 4 to 5 days a month at the First Presbyterian Church of Orange in the Soup Kitchen. I began volunteering in May of 2019 and we were feeding between 40 to 50 people. Today we served 81 first helpings and 18 seconds. For many of those served this is the only hot meal they eat in a day. The reason for my post is that the Soup Kitchen runs solely on donations of money. If you find it in your heart to give, it will bless so many people right here in Orange."

It can simplify your life in many ways, maybe even saving some money.




Mission Project for American Soldiers

The Walk

A Church-wide Study for Lent

Examine five essential spiritual practices rooted in Jesus' own walk with God this Season of Lent

How do we walk with Christ—daily follow him, grow in him, and faithfully serve him? In the Gospels, Jesus modeled for us the Christian spiritual life. The apostles taught it in their writings. And the Church has, through the last 2,000 years, sought to pursue this Christian spiritual life.

Join us this Lenten season as we take part in this new study by Rev. Adam Hamilton. In *The Walk*, Adam Hamilton focuses on five essential spiritual practices that are rooted in Jesus' own walk with God and taught throughout the New Testament. Each of these practices is intended as part of our daily walk with Christ while also being an essential part of growing together in the church.

In each chapter, Hamilton explores one of these practices, its New Testament foundation, and what it looks like to pursue this practice daily in our personal life and together in the life of the church. Deepen your walk with Christ as we explore the five essential practices of worship, study, serving, giving, and bearing witness to our faith.

Pastor Lani will lead a small-group on Wednesday evenings at 6 pm during Wednesday Night Live beginning on March 4. Books will be available with a pre-order through the church office. Let Norma in the church office know how many copies you will need.

Reflection

Parents often teach their children to say thank you at an early age. When the child receives something from a parent, grandparent, sibling or friend, mom or dad will ask, "What do you say?"

As we grow, we learn that gratitude is more than a polite response. It is a way of life. When we live with an attitude of gratitude, we remind ourselves that all that we have – time, faith, family, and more – is a gift from God to be cherished and cared for in the ways God would.

Get them talking

- Who taught you to say "thank you"? What are some ways to express gratitude without saying it?
- Our Bible verse says we should give thanks in <u>every</u> situation. Have you ever had trouble saying thank you? Why?
- How might caring for others be a way of expressing gratitude toward God?

Prayer

Thank you, God, for all the gifts you provide. Teach us to give thanks in every situation in both our words and actions. Amen.

Activity

Have each member of your family share something for which they are thankful. Plan something you can do to express your gratitude by serving someone else. For example, if you are grateful for food, how might you share food with someone who is hungry?
