

Disciple Fast Track Into the Word Into the World is an adaptation of the original, bestselling Disciple Bible Study Into the Word Into the World. The study is ideal for busy people who want to fit an indepth Bible study into their schedule. The study retains the familiar Disciple format with its theme word, theme verse, statement of the human condition, daily and weekly assignments, and prayer. Into the Word helps readers deepen their understanding of Scripture and make connections between what they already know and what they are reading. Each week you will encounter three spiritual disciplines, learn what they are, and how you can engage those disciplines. The first discipline varies from week to week, then moves into Sabbath and prayer. In every session, you commit to how you will respond to Scripture in terms of ministry in the world.



Growing Stronger Disciples

"As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, my God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When can I go and meet with God?" (Psalm 42.1-2)

This image from Psalm 42 of a deer panting for water has always grabbed my attention. Here is an animal so thirsty that it pants for flowing streams of cool water. Everything in him is calling out for the quenching of his thirst. A deer, which usually is dignified and composed, now runs with his tongue hanging out of his mouth in search for water. The psalm doesn't talk about it, but I picture the deer finding that stream, running into the water, and drinking deep. Drinking, drinking, and drinking until the thirst is quenched. Then, lying down on the bank by the stream he rests, taking time every once in a while to drink deep again.

Sometimes I see people walk into worship on Sunday mornings and I can tell by the look in their eyes, they are panting. They are hungry and thirsty. I see them stand to sing that first worship song and no words come out of their mouth. They just stand with their eyes closed and soak it all in. I see them in the Communion line making that walk to the front. Waiting for them is the best meal I know. Waiting for them is a God who wants to quench that longing of the soul.

There are some Sunday mornings I walk into church before anyone has arrived and find myself panting. Mornings I am hungry. Mornings I feel totally inadequate for the day and job before me. There are mornings when I don't feel that I need to be telling others about God. Instead, I just need God. I will kneel on the gym floor and ask God to fill that place that day, and fill me. As I stop, I often can feel it come pouring down from above.

For a church to mature it must remain hungry and thirsty. For a church to grow and become "self-sufficient," it must become more and more dependent on what God can do and what God wants to give. We never grow out of the desperation for more and more of God. Instead as we grow up we (should) become hungrier for what only God can give. Churches like this become places where the hungry for God can be fed, but who never stop wanting more of God.

How do you think churches can better demonstrate their growing desire for God in worship and mission?

How do we keep our growing churches from becoming content instead of striving for more?

Acts of Kindness for January

Kindness You often hear about people performing random acts of kindness... they involve spontaneous, selfless good deeds, often performed for total strangers, in order to make their lives a little bit better. If a random act of kindness can do a little good in the world, how much more good can you do if you plan ahead? With a little bit of forethought, you can perform intentional acts of kindness. What are intentional acts of kindness?

Here are a few examples:

- 1) Leave a note in your mailbox for the post carrier, saying thank you and telling him/her how much you appreciate all of his/her hard work.
- 2) Bake a batch of homemade cookies or brownies for a friend who recently did you a favor, or helped you out when you needed it.
- 3) Send a text to each of your top contacts or favorite contacts in your phone, to let them know that they're important to you, and maybe tell them each something that's special about them.
- 4) Go to the house of a friend or relative who may be getting older, or who otherwise has trouble performing certain tasks on their own, and offer to help them out. Change some light bulbs, mow the lawn, clean and vacuum the house, maybe just cook dinner for them. Make a schedule to continue coming back to help them out on a regular basis, say once a month or so.
