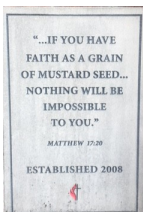
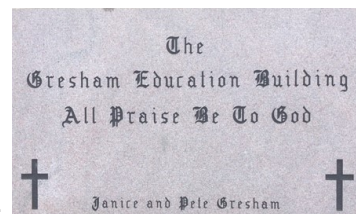

What do you do when you cross a milestone? Celebrate and Praise the Lord!

When I came to First Orange in 2011, we had just moved back into the Education Building, thanks to the work and skill of faithful members. But a portion of the building was still unusable because of the latest hurricane, and our offices were still in the Family Life Center. In the next year through the leadership of our Trustees, we were able to improve our working conditions and move the offices back to their present locations with needed improvements debt free. We had a church that, by the grace of God and the love of the interim Rev. W.C. Hall, was able to welcome Sandra and me into our ministry here in Orange.

On March 21, 2007, the church took out a loan to apply to the cost of building the Family Life Center, which was slated to cost \$2,200,000. In 2008 the Family Life Center became the hub of the church after the rest of the church was damaged by the hurricane. We were so thankful to be able to put the building to use even though it had to be crowded. When I arrived, the building had been refinanced, and we had an outstanding debt of \$950,171.99.

Now almost eleven years to the day, we will celebrate the retirement of that debt due to the generosity of our beloved members Pete and Janice Gresham. In honoring them for their dedication to the church, as well as Janice's love of music and teaching, we have named the education building The Gresham Education Building.



The marker on the Family Life Center reads, "...if you have faith as a grain of mustard seed...nothing will be impossible to you." Matthew 17:20

Thanks to the generosity of these folks and so many others, including Ann Olliff, we will be burning the note of this wonderful building.

Please invite your family and friends as we worship on March 18 at 11 a.m. with the Bishop Scott Jones preaching.

Following the service we will walk to the Family Life Center and burn the note and enjoy a meal together. The church will provide pork tenderloin and members will provide the sides, salads and deserts.

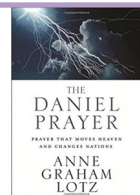

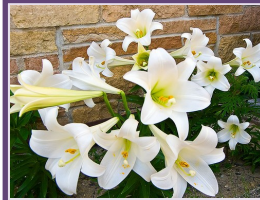

GROWING STRONGER DISCIPLES

How to Grow as a Disciple

by Freedom Corker

Freedom Corker, the author, is part of the Division on Ministries with Young People. Last summer, that group discussed ways our voices as young leaders could be shared in the UMC. Blog posts were one of the ideas. "How to Grow as a Disciple" was the topic given to her:

We grow as a disciple through our RELATIONSHIPS:

- **Relationship with Christ** - Being a disciple means we are a follower of Christ, and in following him, we must definitely know him and establish a solid relationship with him.
- **Relationship with the Community** - Christ lived his life walking the streets and being with the people. He healed the sick, fed the hungry, and sailed with fishermen. John 15:12 commands us to love as Christ has loved us and I believe this is our greatest calling as his disciples: to journey with our community, to stand with people who are experiencing injustices, to walk with the lost, last, and least, and to live a life that promotes God's love for all. Luke 9:23 says "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me".
- **Relationship with other disciples - Occhiolism** is a word I learned when I attended this year's DMYP meeting. It means "the awareness of the smallness of your perspective"...despite the differences in culture, context, and opinions,...I learned how we make an impact on a global scale and this is through the relationship that we have as a church.

We need our fellow disciples to be accountable with us and remind us to fix our eyes on Jesus. Other disciples such as your church, family, friends, or colleagues, can also be your mentor on your lifelong journey and continuous process of discipleship. It is a journey, wherein we cannot neglect the reality that we can be tired, we may get lost, and that we will stumble every now and then. So we definitely need our fellow disciples to be accountable with us and remind us to fix our eyes on Jesus.

This might all sound easy, but I trust you know that relationships aren't always easy to maintain; however, inconvenience could also mean the beginning of growth.

Growing as a disciple takes hard work. And I pray that as we take these things into heart and put a little more effort into our relationship with Christ, our community, and our fellow disciples, that we may experience inconvenience; inconvenience that leads to growth.
