


# **SEAFARER'S CHRISTMAS BOXES**

# **Growing Stronger Disciples**

## **Engaging Your Community – Part 1**

Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." – MATTHEW 9:35-38

The harvest is still plentiful, and the laborers are still few. Today, not unlike the time of Jesus, people still have deep spiritual needs and long for greater meaning for their lives. Some, as in Matthew's text, feel harassed and helpless. Some are searching for good news. Some need healing. Jesus still looks out over our cities and villages and has compassion for all of the people ... and so should we as his disciples.

I remember the nursery rhyme taught to us in Sunday school when we were young ... Here's the church; here's the steeple, open the doors and see all the people. Unfortunately, many churches today might rewrite that rhyme, "open the doors; where are all the people?" Although there are a few examples of towns and cities where jobs and people have left entirely, an overwhelming majority of cities and towns still report growth in population year after year. The problem is not a lack of people. The problem is our inability to see and reach them. We have forgotten why as disciples we are called to reach out in the first place.

When we talk about engaging our communities, we must make sure that our people find and embrace a vision rooted in a deep love for all of God's people—not unlike a love and yearning for a vast and endless sea. Such a love pulls us forward, giving us the courage and the willingness to go wherever God leads. ..... Do we have a heart for all God's people—even the people not personally known to us? even the people who reject God or reject us? even our enemies? Engaging our communities begins here.
