ROOTED IN CHRIST ... BRANCHING OUT IN FAITH ... DISCIPLES GROWING DISCIPLES

Message from Pastor John:

Over the past three weeks, the Service Design Team was started to assist me in creating interesting theme services to relate and open up the Bible to us in worship. This new effort will enrich our worship with the Word of God—You may notice that the music during worship matches the theme of the day. This is also a new concept for your Pastor, and it is exciting to see us growing together in this effort.

Beginning in September and following six weeks, the Service Design Team and I have created a sermon series to go arm in arm with our new church vision statement. We will be looking at these themes and asking ourselves these questions. What does it mean to be rooted in Christ? For you personally and as a church. What does it mean for us to be branching out in faith? What does it mean to be a disciple? And how do we grow them? Am I a disciple?

To find out, come to worship and we will explore together.

502 Initiative

In the last weeks, I have been praying throughout the church. I sat in chairs in the Sunday School rooms around tables and prayed. I plan to continue to pray, and each place I pray, I post a post-it note with the numbers 502. Have you seen them? I have stayed after everyone goes home at 4:30 p.m. and prayed for you in those spots. I have set my alarm to alert me to the time 5:02 to stop doing what I am doing and pray for the church and for you.

Over the next six weeks, I am calling upon you to join me in focused prayer for the ministry and mission of the church. This different kind of prayer I am calling for you to pray is called a "Breakthrough Prayer." This is a brave challenge because we will be opening ourselves up to hear the very voice of God. It may come in an audible voice or a gentle nudge in a certain direction at any rate we will be seeking a break-through in our thinking and understanding of what God hopes and wishes to do in and for us as a church in ministry to the world around us. Our guiding scripture for the six weeks with be Ephesians 3: 20 "Glory to God who is able to do far beyond all that we could ask or imagine, by his power at work within us."

You may have noticed the little post-it notes springing up everywhere with the number 5:02 on them. During the next six weeks, we are calling on all church members to pray a breakthrough prayer for God to work in and through us at 5:02 in the morning or evening. If you are willing to do so, take a picture of where you are when you pray and post it on our Facebook page or on your Facebook and Instagram, etc. When two or more are gathered in Jesus' name, especially in prayer for God's will to be done, we will see an outpouring of His power upon us. This is our breakthrough prayer I am asking you to pray:

"God, we lift First United Methodist Church to you with our prayers. Please do what we cannot do ourselves, including Your changing us without limits. In Jesus name we pray. Amen."

Let's see the exciting prayer work in and through us as we join together in this time of prayer. If you would like to come to the church to pray, I will be happy to give you post-it notes with the number 502 written on them to place in the spot where you prayed. Let's not be shy be BOLD and come and pray. God wants to work boldly in us as He gives us the DIGNITY OF RESPONSIBILITY!

The Five Love Languages:
How to Express Heartfelt
Commitment to Your Mate

by Gary Chapman (facilitators: Ron & Bonnie Hopperton)

Learn the five ways to express and experience love that Chapman calls "love languages": gift giving, quality time, words of affirmation, acts of service (devotion), and physical touch. Examples are given from his counseling practice, as well as questions to help determine one's own love languages.

Chapman suggests that to discover another person's love language, one must observe the way they express love to others, and analyze what they complain about most often and what they request from their significant other most often. He theorizes that people tend to naturally give love in the way that they prefer to receive love, and better communication between couples can be accomplished when one can demonstrate caring to the other person in the love language the recipient understands.
