A Three-Hour Tour Ends in Baptism

ROOTED IN CHRIST ... BRANCHING OUT IN FAITH ... DISCIPLES GROWING DISCIPLES

On Sunday, August 12, we had an awesome day on Village Creek. This year, 38 brave souls took to the water. This is the third year that we have not had to drag a single boat! Nor did we have to escape the creek and run for shelter from a rainstorm. But do not get the idea that there was no excitement. There was!

This year, I was asked to have a little devotion and baptize two people who wanted to be baptized. I said, "Sure, we can do that."

As many of you know, we stop to play on the sand beaches several times on the trip each year, and each time we stopped, I asked, "Is this the spot for the baptism?" Finally, we agreed on the place in the creek where the beach is in the middle. It is a fork in the creek where people have to choose which way to go. I thought that is a appropriate place for a baptism.

I spoke of John the Baptist and the people who came to see him baptize folks and others gathering and asking to be baptized too. It wasn't something that they had to understand. First, they didn't have to complete a confirmation class. Instead, they simply knew they wanted to trust God to take hold of their lives. So after the devotional, I asked the two men—David and Chris—to come forward, and as they came forward, Randall Bridges said he wanted to be baptized too. By the time, I finished with them, there was a whole line of folks wishing to be baptized.

I did not know this, but as I baptized the folks from our church, others on the creek stopped to watch. One lady came forward and asked if I would baptize her son. She said that all of her children had been baptized but him. She explained that all the ministers of her church said they would not baptize him because he did not have the mental capacity to understand what was happening. I

remembered the people holding the children back from Jesus, and his response was, "Let the little children come to me."



Even though her son was in his 20s, he was still a child. The lady had tears in her eyes when I said I would baptize him. I baptized Ronald in Village Creek that day. He may not have understood what was happening, but God knew his and his mother's heart.





One of FUMC's Missions:

The Rainbow

The third Sunday of every month is Rainbow Room Sunday for FUMC.

Room

The Rainbow Room is an emergency resource center that distributes new items, such as clothing, diapers, and formula, to clients of CPS caseworkers free of any overhead or administrative costs. Children, including teenagers, who are removed from their homes stay at the Rainbow Room until they can be placed with a foster family.

The most basic needs of a family in crisis are often unavailable, and caseworkers typically cannot provide the necessities from their personal resources. With the introduction of the Rainbow Room, assistance with basic needs becomes available. This helps to keep families together through traumatic times and can be equally critical in developing a helping relationship between caseworkers and client families.

When children (infants up to 16 year olds) are removed from their homes the parents are not able to pack their things, that is if they have things to pack, and sometimes the children are not old enough to gather all their things together. The children are usually scared and confused and the parents are usually not there or are incapacitated and unable to help. Children often arrive to the Rainbow Room barefooted. Children up to 4 years old are often not potty trained.

Below is a "Wish List" supplied to give you an idea of what is most needed. (New Items Only, please!)

Items most needed at this time are:

- Shoes of all sizes...flip flops and canvas tennis shoes are suggested
- Underwear and socks of all sizes
- Diapers size 3 are most needed but 6,000 diapers per year are used!
- Car seats and Pack 'n plays







GROWING STRONGER DISCIPLES

Our mission is to help each person take the next step in their relationship with Jesus Christ.

Are you taking the next step? Are you in a different place today in your relationship with Jesus than you were six months ago, a year ago, ten years ago? Most people can identify goals, plans, dreams they have for themselves at work, at home, at school, or even physically, intellectually, or relationally. Do you have plan to develop your walk, your relationship with Jesus Christ? What's the status of that relationship today?

During the last four months we have explored the four stages of growth in becoming a mature Christian: Knowing Christ, Growing in Christ, Close to Christ and Christ Centered. We should strive to always grow in our ability to share the Good News of Jesus with our family, friends, and community. To help us as we grow and practice our discipleship skills, we will have a church wide Bible Study



of <u>The Disciple's Path</u> by John Harnish. The study is an engaging approach to discipleship from a distinctly Wesleyan perspective. It guides individuals to take the next step in discipleship and become dynamic, engaged followers of Jesus Christ. Classes will be offered during the Sunday morning Bible Study. The class will also be offered on Sunday evenings starting in October.

Spiritual Growth Survey

We know that the walk of faith is different for each of us, yet our common goal is to grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. To help you in that process of self-examination and growing in faith and knowledge, we've developed a spiritual growth survey designed to examine your beliefs, attitudes, and practices. It's not scientific and the goal isn't to get a "good grade", but rather to determine where we might be in your relationship with Jesus and to commit to growth in ways that will spur us on, help us to take that next step. — This is a tool to quantify your spiritual status at the present time. It is for your personal use.

The Practice of Prayer: † I communicate with God often each day.
