We did a bible study with him that Chris was leading a year ago. We didn't have much time due to the traffic and a time constraint, so we exchanged phone numbers. I'm glad the Lord continues to cross our paths. We are hoping and praying that God works in his heart. Please pray we can keep in contact and for his salvation.

Everything else is going well. The kids are finishing their first 9 weeks of school. Samuel and Elizabeth have been helpful with the children's class in Ananindeua. And we are thankful for their flexibility with school so we can take all the opportunities to do these things. Please keep our children in your prayers as they make all these adjustments with us. So far, my body is holding up to doing jiu-jitsu. I am glad that I have had the opportunity to talk and meet some new people because of it. Please continue to pray that God uses all these avenues for us to share the gospel and to begin bible studies. And as always that Brazilians would be saved.
