**Dear Pastor and Church,**

We bring you very sincere greetings from Ghana with our prayer that you are doing well in the Lord. The Lord has been doing us good and we thank HIM for His love, grace and mercies on and in our lives.

Our radio ministry is doing good with listeners calling from places we never knew the broadcast reaches. Most of the callers talk about how much they appreciate the messages and always look forward to the broadcast days. Others wished it could be a daily broadcast. We have had interactions with others also who do not agree with us. Most of them are into baptismal regeneration and works/commandment keeping salvation. People just can't seem to accept that salvation is planned, paid for and offered freely to sinful man by grace and must be believed. We will continue to proclaim the good news of God's love and grace in providing Jesus Christ, THE PROPITIATION for our sins. Thank you for your partnership in this ministry.

Let me mention two of our missions: Tsibu Baptist Mission and Kekeli Baptist Mission. These are both in the Volta region of our country. Both are headed by graduates of our Bible Institute. They are both indigenous to these areas where the missions are located. They are in the process of building permanent meeting places. Please pray for these leaders to be able to reach their own people. The Tsibu leader is John and Kekeli leader is Richard.

With Brother Abraham now pastoring the newly organized work at Asesewa, I realise I have to make much more contact with the six other missions in the Asesewa area. Please pray with us as we develop a God-honoring strategy to help these missions grow into being organized.

This year our tribal paramount chief suspended our annual festival so we missed our tract distribution. We normally get the opportunity of distributing not less than 5,000 tracts during this period.

We finally buried Pastor Ekow's mother the first weekend of December. I was billed to preach the funeral, but I gave that chance to Brother Jonathan and I preached the next day Thanksgiving service. I took 300 of my booklet I wrote on salvation for distribution and it was woefully inadequate. There were some 700 or even more there.

God has wonderfully opened a door of ministry for us into a small village some twenty miles from my home. I was driving to Accra and I spotted some mushrooms put up for sale. I went there and

bought them and started talking with the vendor. He was very open so we talked and I shared the gospel. He was excited and asked me to get into the village. I went in and met an elderly woman with her daughter and grandchildren and interestingly, they understood my tribe's language so we talked. I found out they are of Gloria's tribe. I came back to the mushroom seller and we set up a Bible study for every Friday. We have started. Please pray for us to stay faithful in this. As I write I will be there tomorrow.

One of the biggest challenges I am having right now is with my Muslim neighbor. He is married to a non-Muslim and they have 6 girls and 1 boy with 3 grandchildren. He is the only practicing Muslim. The boy and three daughters are no more at home. He seems to be in a perpetual war with the family. Two of the girls just finished high school and have started going to church with us but are not yet saved. They love to come and pour out their problems to me, even as their father too. Recently he called to tell me he is suffering and wants me to use my Christianity to change the situation at home for him. Do be praying for me that God will somehow use us to not only bring his children to Christ but he himself too.

The man who sold us the land for the Sawa mission came to us wanting to sell another piece of land to us. This is actually a part we had wanted to buy much earlier but he had refused. He hiked the price up a bit but I decided we should buy so we got it. We made part payment with a promise the rest will be paid by mid January 2022. Sawa is a growing mission.

My family is doing well by God's grace. Our second son, Senyo, was offered a job in London and he took it. We miss him a lot. He will be gone for an initial two years with holidays every year. Then there will be another five years with an offer of staying there until he no longer wants to. Technology makes it possible to video call regularly. I don't like the feeling. I wonder what will happen when the other three finally leave home.

We thank you very much for being fellow labourers with us in the Lord's great Vineyard.
