



Operator of high-stakes poker games featuring celebs, Wall Street bankers, and Russian billionaires, dodges jail

William Barbalat — who operated highstakes illegal poker games in New York dodged jail Wednesday. Manhattan Federal Judge Jesse Furman sentenced Barbalat, 42, to two years of probation and 200 hours of community service.

The sports betting and poker ring at times catered to rich celebrities, Russian millionaires and billionaires and Wall Street bankers, the feds said. Barbalat worked with Arthur Azen, who used mixed martial arts fighters to menace

poker game debtors, according to prosecutors.

"We are pleased at today's outcome and that the judge was able to see our client for who he really is," said Barbalat's lawyer, Silvia Serpe. Prosecutors said Barbalat took a rake, or a percentage of the policy games he hosted.
