

**City of Seven Points  
City Council  
Minutes  
September 25, 2025**

The City Council of Seven Points, Texas met for a Regular Meeting, Thursday, September 25, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. in the City Hall, 715 South Seven Points Blvd. in Seven Points, Texas to discuss the items listed below. These are the minutes from that meeting:

1. Call to order and Roll Call: Mayor Keith Betts, Mayor Pro-Tem Valerie Bahm, Council Members Charles Longacre, Kevin Reynolds, and Mary Wennerstrom. LaJohnna Wells. A quorum was present.
2. The invocation was led by Council Member Charles Longacre and Mayor Keith Betts led the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Mayor Betts opened a public hearing to receive comment regarding the adoption of the proposed City of Seven Points Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Budget presented by Mayor Betts. Council member Mary Wennerstrom stated the budget presented by Mayor Betts had some miscalculated figures in it, some overstated and some understated. Mayor Betts commented we needed to pass a budget and this is estimated cost to begin with and we can amend the budget when needed. Council member Mary Wennerstrom stated the budget he presented was not in balance and the budget bottom line should always be zero (\$0.00). The \$140,000.00 that was in question is what it would cost the city to get insurance for the city workers and that is the reason for it not being balanced. If the city council approved of providing insurance the \$140,000.00 would have been entered in the appropriate place. After several minutes of bickering back and forth and the appearance of not being able to come to a decision on the budget, council member Charles Longacre and Kevin Reynolds got up and left the meeting. Due to this being a special called meeting we are required to have four (4) council members present and with the disruption we only have three (3) council members left so Mayor Betts had to adjourn the meeting.

No other items were discussed.

The meeting was adjourned by Mayor Keith Betts.
