

### PHYSICAL THERAPY

Physical therapists are 'movement specialists' and as therapists specializing in pediatrics, we look at movement from birth on to adulthood. We work with infants who are not quite meeting their milestones such as rolling, sitting, crawling or walking. We work with children who are having trouble with balance and coordination, strength, pain or difficulty keeping up with their peers.



### OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

Occupational therapists work with patients from birth up to adulthood who need help achieving independence with their 'job' of being a kid. They focus more on the fine motor development of infants and children which includes everything from eye/hand control, reaching and grasping to handwriting, and ADL's as well as everything in between. We have therapists trained in the SOS Approach to Feeding, and SI (sensory integration).



### SPEECH THERAPY

Speech Language Pathologists work with patients on their speech and language development, as well as feeding problems. They work on both receptive and expressive language, infant feeding problems, and problem feeders. In speech therapy we see patients from birth to 21 years of age.
